Jizo Bodhisattva Service "Compassion for Children and Animals" Sunday, August 11 10:00 a.m.

Dharma Talk by Rev. Jiko Nakade Potluck Lunch

All are invited to attend this service at which our sangha will pay homage to O-jizōsama through meditation, music, and chant. The bodhisattva Jizō, also known as O- jizōsama in Japanese and Kṣitigarbha in Sanskrit, is enshrined in a small structure in front of the temple. Jizō is regarded as the protector of travelers, women, and children and is the patron bodhisattva of deceased babies and children. He also liberates beings from realms of suffering and displays great compassion for animals. A portion of the service will be dedicated to the memory of deceased children. This year, Rev. Aloha Sangha members and friends,

First of all, my warmest mahalo to all who helped with and attended our temple's wonderful Bon Dance on July 13.

Our next major event is the Jizō Bodhisattva service to which all are cordially invited. Throughout much of Daifukuji's history, an annual service called the Jizō Matsuri (Jizō Festival) has been held. At this service

prayers have been offered for beloved family members who died in infancy and childhood, or as a result of abortion, miscarriage, or having been stillborn. This year, I have decided to include prayers for pets. We all know that for many people, a pet is a cherished family member and companion. This has certainly been the case in my own family. Akin to losing a beloved child, the loss of a beloved pet can be devastating. Part of the purpose of the Jizō Bodhisattva service is to offer healing to those who grieve the loss of their precious children.

The compassion of Jizō Bodhisattva is boundless and vast. In Buddhist art Jizō is often surrounded by children. He carries a monk's staff with six rings that jingle as he walks, letting animals and little creatures know that he is approaching. This gentle, yet courageous bodhisattva enfolds babies and animals alike in his robes of compassion, encouraging us to do the same. All life is to be loved and cherished. All beings are to be treated with compassion and loving-kindness. This is Jizō Bodhisattva's message. On August 11th, please join me in paying homage to the noble bodhisattva Jizō. Daifukuji Soto Mission Legacy Endowment Fund

Aloha Members & Friends of Daifukuji,

The parking area in front of our temple was recently re-paved and looks great. It should also be safer for events we have outside. The Board of Directors did a fantastic job working with our contractor to make sure this much needed project went smoothly. This was also the first project that your Endowment Fund helped to finance. As of this date, your Endowment Fund's balance exceeds \$800,000 with over \$220,000 in earnings available for maintenance projects such as this, subject to annual spending caps. In its relatively short time in existence the Endowment Fund and your donations have created a substantial legacy gift to ensure that the Daifukuji grounds and purpose will endure.

When I look at the temple grounds, I'm struck by its beauty and the peacefulness it inspires. And it made me reflect on our dear friend that we lost last year, Judie Myoko Fekete. Judie was on the Board of Directors when we first discussed establishing an endowment fund and became one of its earliest and most enthusiastic supporters. It's no exaggeration to say that without Judie's early support, our Endowment Fund might not exist. And it makes sense because, as we all know, Judie made maintaining the temple buildings and grounds one of her top priorities. She formed groups to clean the cemetery, was on constant alert for termites, and cleaned, maintained and fixed anything that needed attention. She understood the importance of maintaining a peaceful sanctuary for all of us. I think Myoko would be very happy with the results of the Endowment Fund's first project.

Gift Shop News

The recently published eight-volume hardback set of the Shobogenzo in English from Sotoshu Shumucho has arrived at the gift shop. It will be sold at cost. The price is \$366 if paid by cash or check and \$375 if paid by credit card. That amount covers what the shop paid for the set plus the excise tax that is paid to the state, and if a credit card is used, the fee that the shop is charged is passed on to the customer. Usually the shop absorbs the amount of the excise tax as well as the credit card fee because usually there's a bit of a markup, but in

this case there is absolutely no markup. You're paying what the shop is paying.

In the late fall we expect to receive the Shobogenzo set in paperback from the University of Hawaii Press. The retail price will probably be something below \$200 and it too will be sold at cost. The difference in the durability of the hardback and paperback editions will be night and day. It is unknown how long the shop will be able to continue to get hardback editions, but it is likely to be not much longer. Once their gone, they will be out-of-print and the value will escalate dramatically.
