A scroll showing the reclining Buddha surrounded by his followers and animals in mourning will be displayed inside the temple. In his last discourse, the Buddha taught that although the physical body dies, the Dharma is eternal. By taking refuge in the Three Treasures and practicing the precepts, we can see that the Buddha is always with us. A Dharma message will be delivered by Rev. Jikō.

New Year, New Vision

Aloha everyone,

Happy Year of the Fire Horse to all! It was a joy to see many sangha members at Daifukuji's New Year's Day blessing service.

A new year has begun and I'm looking at the world through new eyes. A few days ago I underwent cataract surgeries in Hilo. Shortly after leaving the surgery center I looked at majestic Mauna Kea in the distance and was able to see not only snow at the summit, but also the gleaming observatories. Free of the cataracts that had obstructed my vision, my new eyes looked upon a world that appeared brighter, clearer, and more vibrant. I could clearly see the leaves rustling on the trees and the faces of people walking along the streets. I was amazed! It goes without saying that I am grateful for modern medicine and surgical techniques.

This experience made me reflect upon the Dharma, the teachings of the Buddha that help us to "see reality more clearly." Too often we look at the world through lenses of hate, fear, prejudice, judgment, and delusion. We see the world through lenses thickened by layers upon layers of conditioning, molded by our thoughts and experiences. Through our study of the Dharma and our practice of *zazen* and the Buddha's teachings, we become intimate friends with our own minds. Our hearts open; our vision becomes clearer. Like the Bodhisattva Kannon we start to look at the world with warm eyes of compassion; we walk more gently through life.

Speaking of walking, at this moment there are a group of Buddhist monks who are on a 120-day 2,300-mile "Walk for Peace" from Fort Worth, Texas to Washington D.C. Hundreds, if not thousands, of people flock to catch a glimpse of the saffron-robed monks as they walk through cities, towns, and along country roads. Accompanied by their gentle dog Aloka, they have been touching and transforming lives along the way, spreading their message of peace. Simply by walking.

Compassion. Acceptance. Kindness. Understanding. Mindfulness. Stillness. These are the virtues demonstrated by the humble monks as they walk, step by step, breath by breath, bestowing blessings along the way. In contrast to the fear, hatred, and violence that are the causes of much suffering in our country, simply by walking for peace, the monks bring hope, unity, and healing to many. Inspired and humbled, I am following their journey day after day. May the monks, all people, and all beings be safe and happy.

Namu kie butsu.. Namu kie hō. Namu kie sō.

We take refuge in the Buddha. We take refuge in the Dharma. We take refuge in the Sangha.

Soto Zen Japan Tour 2026

Travel dates: October 13 - 21, 2026

On behalf of the Hawaii Soto Mission Association (HSMA) and the Bishop's Office, it is my great pleasure to invite you to join us on a very special journey: the Soto Zen Japan Tour 2026, taking place from October 13 to 21, 2026.

The heart of this pilgrimage is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to visit Soto Zen Buddhism's two headquarter temples—Eiheiji and Sojiji. These temples are not only historically and spiritually significant; they are living centers of practice where the spirit of Dogen Zenji continues to be embodied through daily training, ritual, and community. For many practitioners, visiting these temples is a lifelong aspiration, and doing so as part of an organized Soto Mission tour adds a depth of meaning that cannot be replicated when traveling alone.

This journey also offers something refreshingly different from the typical “Golden Route” between Tokyo and Osaka. Beginning in Nagoya, our route takes us through regions rich in culture, history, and natural beauty—areas that many travelers never experience. Along the way, we will enjoy scenic landscapes, charming towns, and meaningful cultural encounters, traveling together at a relaxed and thoughtful pace rather than rushing by *shinkansen* from one major city to the next.

As outlined in the itinerary, the tour includes opportunities to:

- Visit historic temples and sacred training sites · Experience regional Japanese culture and traditions
- Enjoy seasonal scenery and thoughtfully selected attractions · Savor a variety of delicious local cuisine

Gift Shop News

Sangha member Amy Shōzen Chung has sewn and donated *wagesa* cases of beautiful fabric which the shop is selling for \$10 each.

We've just received a shipment of scrolls from Japan. The two vintage scrolls show Kannon with the Hannyashingyo and the two new scrolls show the Buddha with twelve Bodhisattvas. The white-robed Kannon is handpainted and the others are prints. The colorful standing Kannon has a background of the Hannyashingyo printed one thousand times. Each scroll is \$100.

The gift shop needs two things — people to volunteer as cashiers and someone to build a freestanding book display unit.

Cashier volunteers would hopefully be able to commit to either: a three-hour shift weekly or a one- to three-hour shift on the monthly Sundays when the temple has a major service. Working in the shop is a great way to learn more about Buddhism, and to meet our congregation members as well as Buddhists from all over the world. Working in a Buddhist gift shop is a rare and wonderful opportunity. Here's what longtime volunteer Hannah Horan has to say about it, "Volunteering in the Daifukuji Gift shop can be a very rewarding experience. By volunteering, you have a great opportunity to meet or become better acquainted with our Sangha, community members, and visitors to our island. You learn about Buddhism through the myriad collections of books and Buddhist devotional items that we offer for sale. You also have the opportunity to listen and learn when Clear exchanges conversations with visitors who are asking perhaps about a scroll, a statue of a Bodhisattva, or a book of Zen poems. Volunteering in the Gift Shop is a great way to give back to Daifukuji while enriching your life."

The freestanding book display unit will replace the rolling metal book cart which used to be rolled out onto the temple lanai and put between the minister's residence door and the choba door. That little cart hasn't rolled in years and its space in the shop would be better used to hold a taller, stationary display unit. Hidden Gem

Kosho Uchiyama's *Opening the Hand of Thought* (Massachusetts, 2004) is one of the books that have influenced me greatly during my study of Zen. In rereading this book, I still find many valuable insights.

In a preface to the book, Uchiyama says, "What I want for you, the reader, is that you understand with your own intellect that Zen concerns the true depth of life that is beyond the reach of that intellect." (p. 30)

To me, the expression, "the true depth of life," indicates what zazen practitioners experience when they put thinking aside and return to their breathing. This experience, being beyond thought, slumbers inexpressibly under the surface of consciousness. It cannot be described to anyone else any more than to oneself. It doesn't need a name. It is a secret, invaluable, personal gem provided to those who sit zazen.
