## Daifukuji's Bodhi Tree: The End of My Story (Maybe)

I began telling the story of Daifukuji's Bodhi tree in the October, 2025 newsletter and continued it in the November and December newsletters. Last month, I introduced Oregon State University biology professor Dee Denver, Ph.D. and Jazlee Crowley, a Ph.D. ethnobiology student, whose DNA genetic testing of Daifukuji's Bodhi tree revealed that it is a propagate clone of the original Tree of Enlightenment. What this means is that our humble Bodhi tree standing in the corner of the yard is a descendant of the tree under which the Buddha attained enlightenment in India over 2,500 years ago. Wow! How did this happen?

It turns out that, as an expression of his gratitude for his friend Mary Foster, Anagarika Dharmapala had a cutting from the Bodhi tree in Sri Lanka, which was a descendent of the original Bodhi tree, shipped to her. Mary had it planted in her garden in Honolulu in 1913 and it is still there today, standing magnificently near the garden's entrance. Cuttings and seeds from this tree were given to many Buddhist temples in Hawai'i.

Somehow, a seed or plant was brought to Daifukuji. No one remembers who planted our Bodhi tree. Fortunately, the plant took root in Kona's rocky lava soil and grew until it towered over the temple. The tree has had to be pruned back a few times in order to contain its spread. Looking at the size of its trunk, biologist Jazlee Crowley estimates our tree to be about 60 years old.

Our Bodhi tree directly connects our temple and sangha to Dr. Patricia Masters and Mary Elizabeth Mikahala Robinson Foster of Honolulu, to Anagarika Dharmapala of Sri Lanka, to the Bodhi tree in Sri Lanka which was a descendant of the original Bodhi tree, and to the Bodhi tree in Bodh Gaya, India today, which is also a descendant of the original tree. What we have learned from this story is that the web of connections that holds us together on this planet is wondrous and vast. We are all intimately connected in ways that we cannot even imagine. Over 2,500 years ago a tree provided shelter and shade for a seeker of the truth named Siddharta Gautama, and witnessed his great enlightenment under its branches. Today, a descendent of this very tree stands in our temple's yard here in Kona, Hawai'i. In awe, I bow deeply in gratitude.

Does the story end here? I think not. Recently, two *keiki* plants, cultivated by Tyrone Ohta from seeds from our Bodhi tree, were gifted to Taishoji Soto Mission in Hilo. This story continues!


**Saturdays from 8 a.m. - 9 a.m. HST (January 24 & 31, February 7 & 28, March 7)**

## **Proposed Changes to the Daifukuji Soto Mission Bylaws**



**At the upcoming annual general membership which will be held on January 25, 2026, there will be two proposed changes to the bylaws to consider.**

**The first change is in bill-paying procedures, to allow us to adapt to changing bank procedures and requirements, and to the use of the modern variety of payment methods.**

The existing bill paying by-law is:

“Section 4.7 Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer

The treasurer shall receive all money paid to the DSM and keep a financial record of such transactions. All money payable by the DSM shall be paid ~~by check signed by the Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer, and/or Board president.~~ The Year-End Report shall be submitted at the second annual meeting of the Board of Directors.”

The proposed by-law is:

“Section 4.7 Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer

The treasurer shall receive all money paid to the DSM and keep a financial record of such transactions. All money payable by the DSM shall be paid from accounts and by means authorized by the Board of Directors, under the general supervision of the treasurer. The assistant treasurer will assist as directed by the treasurer. The Year-End Report shall be submitted at the second annual meeting of the Board of Directors.”

**The second change adds a standing committee.**

The existing committee bylaw is:

“Section 7.1 Standing Committees

There shall be the following standing committees: Temple Repair & Maintenance Committee ~~and the Nominating Committee~~”

The proposed bylaw is:

“Section 7.1 Standing Committees

There shall be the following standing committees: Temple Repair & Maintenance Committee, the Nominating Committee, and the Ministerial Relations Committee.”
