Please join us on a ritualized pilgrimage to the 33 Kannon temples of western Japan. This service has been held annually at Daifukuji since 1948. Thirty-three statuettes of Kannon-sama, the Bodhisattva of Compassion, will be displayed in the Kannon Hall. While the sutras are chanted, the pilgrims circulate the hall, stepping onto small packets of earth brought to Kona many years ago from each of the temples. It is a practice to offer a coin to each Kannon-sama. You will need a total of 36 coins. A spring Higan service will also be held. The Dharma message will be given by Rev. Jikō Nakade.

Lunch will be a potluck. Please label your dish as vegetarian, vegan, gluten-free, etc. to aid those with allergies and food preferences. Also, please help our temple be eco-friendly by bringing your own set of re-usable tableware. The gift shop will be open.

From March 22 - 26 you may come to the temple to do the pilgrimage on your own. Feel free to bring family members and friends. To ensure that the temple is open, it is best to call ahead (808-322-3524). Please note that there will be no Kannon-ko service on March 18.

Annual Report by Temple President Barb Shōshin

At the general membership meeting of Daifukuji Soto Mission, held at the New Year's party on January 25, 2026, temple president Barbara Shōshin Bosz gave the following report on the Daifukuji Board and sangha's 2025 accomplishments.

Last year, our treasured Dogen and Keizan statues were crated and shipped to Oahu. Beautifully restored by Thor Minnick, the statues are back on the altar and ready for many more years.

The social hall kitchen was painted by member Gustavo Leite and new kitchen flooring installed by Miyabi Interiors.

In March, we held our 33 Kannon pilgrimage. There were well-attended Zazen retreats and temple tours.

The temple roof was washed and checked; the rotted roof ornaments were taken down to be remade by Tai Lake. We have very nice drone footage of the temple and grounds taken by Joel Reese.

In April, a group of nineteen from Daifukuji attended the 58th UHSSWA conference on Oahu, and in May the carp in our front yard were flying for Children's Day. The Graduates' Blessing, Memorial Day service, and Mother's Day ceremonies were all well attended. Employment, Position, Ethics, Benefits, & Minister's Role documents were prepared and approved by the Board.

Three African Tulip trees were cut down and mulched behind the temple. There were taiko performances and a Gift Shop booth at the Community Obon Fest at the Makaeo pavilion. At Daifukuji, a shibori workshop and Mindfulness & Meditation sessions were held. Three trees in the front yard were trimmed. In August, the annual Orchid Show, as well as a Fujinkai Fellowship Day at Taishoji were held. The Fujinkai held both a tote bag sewing project for the upcoming UHSSWA Conference and made hand-sewn dolls for Family Support Services. Our annual online auction brought in over \$16,000 – mahalo nui loa to our donors, bidders & helpers! Also of note, a Bodhi Tree plaque was made and the Zazenkai donated the cleaning of the temple carpet. Our taiko group participated in the Big Island Taiko Festival held in Hilo.

The 10th U.S. Soto Conference was held on Oahu and attended by a group of sixteen from Daifukuji. The hall kitchen was organized & deep cleaned by the Fujinkai. Certificates were awarded to four Baikako members, and Teri Jigen gave a talk and demo on Baikaryu Eisanka at the Kealakekua Library. A Soto Zen confirmation ceremony which was officiated by Bishop Shuji Komagata was held. The bishop also brought us several sets of Daihannya sutra books donated by the Hawaii Soto Mission Association. We will have a cabinet made to store them on our Kannon altar. Our first Daifukuji booth at Kokua Kailua Stroll was in December. The Gift Shop had half-price sales, and the Fujinkai held a holiday craft making session & sale. The Bodhi Tree stand and plaque are now in place, thanks to the efforts of Warren Ikeda.

Our groups that meet monthly are Project Dana, Shakyō, Sangha Sisters, Baikako, Happy Strummers, and the Kona Daifukuji Orchid Club. The groups that meet more often are Dharma Keiki, adult and youth Taiko, online Dharma classes, Fujinkai, Gift Shop, Little Fire Ant Team, Library, Samu Group, Maintenance Committee, Soleful Strutters, Qigong, Yoga, & Zazenkai, as well as special classes.

We have also been given help year-round from our Jizoku (minister's spouse) Michael Nakade and our Deacon Amy Jikai Nakade. Mahalo for all you both do to support Rev Jikō and our temple. 2025 was very full year!

Rev. Jikō will be retiring in 2028 after over 20 years of service to Daifukuji, our Kona Community, Hawaii Soto Shu, and beyond. We love her and Mike and wish them all the best in retirement. We have been so fortunate to have her leadership all these years as she is a shining light and the temple's bodhisattva. To prepare for this transition, the Daifukuji Board of Directors sent an offer of employment to Rev. Hirosato Yoshida for the position of Associate Resident Minister in 2027, which he has accepted. Rev. Yoshida is our hope for taking over after a 12-month period of mentorship under Rev. Jikō, who will serve as Senior Minister. He comes from the Soto Mission of Hawaii Betsuin in Honolulu and is also the minister of Zenshuji Soto Zen Temple on Kauai. He is a young minister who will be moving to Kona with his wife Aika and their two children. He was raised both in Japan and Hawaii, and will eventually have to return to Japan to take over his father's temple. Rev. Yoshida has been a speaker here at our temple several times, and comes highly recommended by Bishop Komagata, Rev. Jikō and our Board. If you were at Daifukuji's Centennial Celebration in 2014, you would have witnessed his incredible yo-yo skills. Of course, he has many more skills! He is here with us today at our New Year's party and I am very happy to introduce him. He and his family will be coming to Daifukuji in April for the 59th UHSSWA conference that is being hosted by the Daifukuji Fujinkai and our sangha. You'll have a chance to get to know them.

As we begin this new year, we keep in our hearts those sangha members who have passed on. They have touched our lives and will always remain a part of our temple's history.

Our plans for 2026 include a CPR workshop and basic life support training in February. We would like one representative from each of our temple groups to attend. Also, our next online auction will be held in September. In October, 2026 there will be a Hawaii Soto Mission pilgrimage tour to Japan led by Bishop Komagata. Twenty-eight Daifukuji members, to be accompanied by Rev. Jikō, have registered for this tour. The tour is already filled and there is a wait list.

Greetings from Rev. Jikō

I begin with a heartfelt mahalo to thank everyone who contributed their time, energies, talents, donations, and aloha to Daifukuji's New Year's party. It takes a sangha with everyone pitching in to hold such a major event. To all, I express my sincere gratitude.

At Daifukuji's general membership meeting, our temple president Barb Shōshin announced my retirement, which, if all goes smoothly, is planned for the summer of 2028. It was nice of Rev. Hiroshiro Yoshida to make time in his busy schedule to fly over from Honolulu to be present when Barb announced that he has accepted the position of Resident Associate Minister offered to him by the Daifukuji Board of Directors. I am deeply grateful not only to Rev. Yoshida and his family, but also to the members of our Board who worked very hard last year to formulate a transition plan.

The next two years will be a period of gradual transition. Improvements are being made to the minister's residence into which Rev. Yoshida and family will move during the summer of 2027. Once they arrive, I will be taking on the position of Senior Minister, will have moved off temple grounds, and will concentrate on guiding what I'm optimistic will be a smooth, gradual, and joyful 12-month period of transition.

It has truly been a privilege and honor for me to have served as Daifukuji's resident minister since 2004 and I promise to keep doing my best until the time comes to pass the Dharma baton to Rev. Yoshida, in whom I have much confidence and trust. I know that he will do his best, with the support of his wife Mrs. Aika Yoshida, to keep Buddha's light burning brightly at Daifukuji. I humbly ask each one of you for your support and kōkua.

If given the opportunity in my retirement, I would like to continue to serve Daifukuji and the Hawaii Soto Mission temples in new ways. I would like to continue my study of Buddhism, learn Baikaryu Eisanka by joining the Baikako choir, and perhaps put together a collection of stories and essays about Daifukuji. There are always countless ways to be of service and walk the path of the Dharma together with all of you and with all beings. Amy Jikai has said that she would be happy to continue to serve as Daifukuji's deacon under Rev. Yoshida. Our family will be living in Kona and will continue to offer our support whenever possible.

Rev. and Mrs. Yoshida and their two children, Sosuke and Hina, will be here at Daifukuji for the UHSSWA conference the weekend of April 18 and 19. In addition, Rev. Yoshida will be speaking at Daifukuji's Memorial Day service on May 31 and also at our Bodhidharma (Daruma-ki) service on October 25, 2026. He's very excited about becoming the 13th successive minister of our temple in 2028. May all conditions be favorable.

The Three Candles

Recently, during zazen I found my mind returning to the candle, wondering why this image kept presenting. As I sat in quiet meditation this is what eventually clarified, and I contemplated:

The candles we light in the hondo on the main altar before Buddha is the light of the Dharma, the eternal brilliance that guides the WAY, the path to end all suffering.

The candles before Kannon-sama illuminate the radiant face of Compassion, the One who hears the cries of the afflicted. But there is another candle: it is the candle that shines within each of us. This is the gentle light of Self-Realization, the understanding of our Buddha nature. This is the candle that, once lit, cannot be extinguished.

Working in the shop is a great way to learn more about Buddhism, and to meet our congregation members as well as Buddhists from all over the world. Working in a Buddhist gift shop is a rare and wonderful opportunity. Here's what longtime volunteer Hannah Horan has to say about it, "Volunteering in the Daifukuji Gift shop can be a very rewarding experience. By volunteering, you have a great opportunity to meet or become better acquainted with our Sangha, community members, and visitors to our island. You learn about Buddhism through the myriad collections of books and Buddhist devotional items that we offer for sale. You also have the opportunity to listen and learn when Clear exchanges conversations with visitors who are asking perhaps about a scroll, a statue of a Bodhisattva, or a book of Zen poems. Volunteering in the Gift Shop is a great way to give back to Daifukuji while enriching your life."

The freestanding book display unit will replace the rolling metal book cart which used to be rolled out onto the temple lanai and put between the minister's residence door and the choba door. That little cart hasn't rolled in years and its space in the shop would be better used to hold a taller, stationary display unit.
